OUR MISSION

The Floyd County Solid Waste Management District is the primary agency charged with advancing recycling in Floyd County. We operate two drop off centers (3005 Grant Line Road in New Albany, and at the Floyd County Digital Library in Galena). We also provide a cardboard pick-up service for approximately 35 businesses, schools and non-profits every week. The district is funded primarily by funds drawn from the Economic Development Income Tax (EDIT) managed by the Floyd County Commissioners, and the County Adjusted Gross Income Tax (CAGIT). Additionally, the district assesses fees for electronics recycling (TV's, computers, printers, etc.) and household hazardous wastes. The district is governed by a board comprised of leaders from Floyd County government, the City of New Albany, and the Town of Georgetown.

Name Change

The State of Indiana established Solid Waste Management Districts in 1992 to promote recycling throughout the state. However, the term "Solid Waste" doesn't really describe anything about the true purpose of the organization: Recycling! **To address this, our District branded itself as "Recycle Floyd County" in 2022.** Our purpose is now unmistakable! (www.recyclefc.com)

50 by 30

Every effective organization should have a vision with established goals to achieve them. Our board of directors approved an ambitious goal in March 2022 to become the first county in Indiana to recycle **50%** of its municipal solid waste stream. The aim is to achieve this by **2030**. The 50% goal was established long ago by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM). Thus, **50 by 30!** We are convinced that our county's status as the second smallest county (geographically-speaking) in the state along with the strong base of motivated recyclers can make it happen. While there is no clear path to 50%, there are three steps that are foundational to this effort. First, we must leverage every marketing and communications tool available to us (website, print, social media) to build awareness of the need for and the value of recycling. Second, we must ensure our county's recycling infrastructure is as accessible as possible to our citizens. This not only includes our drop-off sites at the North Annex on Grant Line Road in New Albany, and the site located at the Digital Library in Galena, but also the 35 businesses, non-profits and schools we serve via a weekly pick-up. And third, we must build partnerships with the independent private companies who provide trash pick-up around the county to ensure a consistent message with clear measures is reaching every citizen.
